On Saturday, May 10, the Black Educators Association (BEA) will hold its nineteenth annual Regional Educators Program (REP) Provincial Spelling BEE with up-to-100 spellers pre-registered for the competition. 2025 marks the 19th Anniversary of the Program and the Black Educators Association acknowledges its partner - the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) along with donations from businesses, organizations and corporations across Nova Scotia. Interim President Hudson will be on hand to present the trophies to this year's winners. Admission to the competition is free and open to staff of EECD, members of the Black Educators Association, parents and families across Nova Scotia and the public. BEA's challenging academic competition is held in May during the same time as the US-based Scripps National Spelling Bee and is open for registration to Black students aged eight to 15 years across the province and any student enrolled in a CAEP - Cultural Academic Enrichment Program (an after-school program) operated by the Black Educators Association. First, second and third-place winners will take home BEA Education Awards of \$1,000, \$800 and \$500 respectively; each winner will also receive a Samsung Galaxy tablet and assorted gift cards and prizes from local businesses. The purpose of the Regional Educators Program Provincial Spelling BEE is to focus on English language basics; foster learning of African Nova Scotian students studying the English language; and introduce and encourage students to compete in regional, national and international finals.
